- Croydon, Surrey
- Between 4-8 mph
- The coroner said he hoped "such a thing would never happen again."

Our focus - Core role of high visibility patrols, positive engagement and appropriate enforcement with drivers and other road users, influencing road user behaviour and making Scotland's roads safer.

Objectives

- Effective patrolling of the roads.
- Influence driver and road user behaviour.
- Detect and deter all types of criminality on our roads.
- Combat the threat of terrorism.
