Being prepared



Tell someone where you are going and take everything that you are going to need.

Getting on the bus



Wait for the bus to stop and open its doors. You can ask the driver if you are on the right bus. Have the right money or bus pass

Bus timetable



You might have a bus timetable. If not check at the bus stop for the bus number and times.

Traffic light crossing



Sometimes a beeping sound tells you that the green man is showing.

Looking around



Look out for places that you recognise. This will help you know which stop to get off the bus.

Getting off the bus



Ask the driver where the stop is for your return journey. Step onto the pavement and stand back from the kerb.

Next steps

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On the bus



When the bus is moving be sure not to distract the driver and to sit quietly.

Stopping the bus



When it is time to get off, press the bell and wait. Be careful to remain seated or hold on tight before getting off.

Thinking ahead



On the way check for landmarks that will help you to find the bus stop for your return journey. Make sure you have enough money to get home.

Zebra crossing



Stop, think, look and listen. Zebra crossings are safer places to cross but you must still be very careful, don't cross until the road is clear or the traffic has stopped.

Narrow pavements



It is better to stay on the pavement away from the road by walking behind your friends if the pavement is too narrow.

Pedestrian-friendly area



You will sometimes find streets in town centres which are pedestrian-friendly walkways. Cars have limited access.

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Landmarks



When you are returning to your bus stop look for signs and shops you recognise.

Bus shelter



Check you are at the right place to catch your bus.

Asking the driver



The driver is there to help you. Ask the driver if you are unsure of anything about your journey.

Belongings



Make sure you keep your bags with you and that they don't block the passage.

Watching the time



You might be distracted by a friend or a nice shop. Make sure you have enough time to return when you are expected.


Getting off



Wait for the bus to stop. Then get out of your seat and step down off the bus onto the pavement and stand away from the kerb.

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Time



Check the time of the bus home and give yourself plenty of time. You might have to cross the road.

Zebra crossing



After you have checked that nothing is coming step off the pavement and keep looking as you cross.

Bus shelter



Check the shelter number, check the bus stop and the bus number. You might have to wait.

Asking people



The driver will be glad to answer any questions you might have.

Traffic light crossing



A bumpy pavement indicates that you have reached a crossing point.

Red man



If the road is clear and the red man is showing it is not safe to cross. Stay on the pavement and wait for the green man.

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
