WHAT IS THE SPEED CAMPAIGN?

1 in 5 deaths on Scotland's roads are caused by speeding.

The Scottish Government, including the Scottish Safety Camera Programme, is tackling the serious issue of speeding with a new road safety campaign, asking drivers to slow down to help reduce collisions and casualties.

No matter how experienced you are as a driver, a collision can happen to anyone, and the consequences could be devastating. The new campaign delivers a strong message to drivers – you only have to lose control once.

In this toolkit you will find more information and key messages to help you share the campaign wider, example social media posts for your own channels, and links to access campaign assets.

KEY MESSAGES

1 in 5 deaths on Scotland's roads are caused by speeding.

Safety cameras play a crucial role in making our roads safer by helping to reduce speed, collisions and casualties - ultimately saving lives.

Research shows that fatal collisions caused by drivers going at 65mph could be halved if the drivers slowed down by just 5mph.

Safety cameras are placed where they can have the most impact and the greatest potential to reduce speeding and collisions.

A collision could happen to anyone - no matter how good a driver you think you are. You only have to lose control once.

Nearly half of reported casualties on Scotland's roads take place on rural roads; however, because speeds are higher on these roads they account for almost three quarters of road deaths.

Safety cameras are aimed at improving driver behaviour. By reducing speeding we can reduce the number of people being killed and injured on Scotland's roads.
