

What is the drink and drug-driving campaign?

The Scottish Government and Police Scotland have launched an enforcement campaign to tackle drink and drug-driving, highlighting the criminal and personal consequences of being found guilty of driving with alcohol or drugs in your system.

With Police Scotland recording a total of 831 drink and drug-driving offences during last year's festive period¹, this hard-hitting campaign reminds drivers that drink and drug-driving are not worth the risk.

The advertising campaign highlights how easy it is to catch drug-drivers, that just one drink can put you over the limit, and reminds drivers that you can still be over the limit the morning after. The campaign will run during the festive period on radio, digital and outdoor channels, supported by a PR and social media campaign along with partnership and field activity.





Key messages

We'll be communicating key messages during the campaign including:

Overall

It's easy to catch drink and drug-drivers.

Driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs can destroy lives.

Alcohol and drugs can slow down your responses, making a collision more likely. This can lead to severe injury or death, as well as a driving ban, hefty fine and a prison sentence.

Drink-driving

Having just one drink can put you over the limit.

You could still be over the limit the morning after.

If convicted of drink-driving, you could face a 12-month driving ban, a fine up to £5,000 and up to six months in prison.

Drug-driving

Almost 50% of roadside drug tests are positive.

Police in Scotland carry drug testing kits and can carry out immediate roadside testing for any driver they suspect of drug-driving.

If convicted of drug-driving, you could face a 12month driving ban, 3-11 points on your licence and up to six months in prison.

Drugs can stay in a user's system for hours and even days after consumption and would still be detected by a simple roadside drug test.



Drinking tonight? Plan your journey ahead for tomorrow. You could still be over the limit the morning after and, if caught, you could face a 12-month driving ban, a fine of up to £5,000 and up to six months in prison. Don't risk it. #ArriveAlive







Before heading out, remember driving under the influence of drugs is dangerous and illegal. If convicted of drug-driving, you could face a 12-month driving ban, a maximum of 11 points on your licence and up to six months in prison. Plan your travel ahead and ensure you have a safe way to get home. #ArriveAlive
